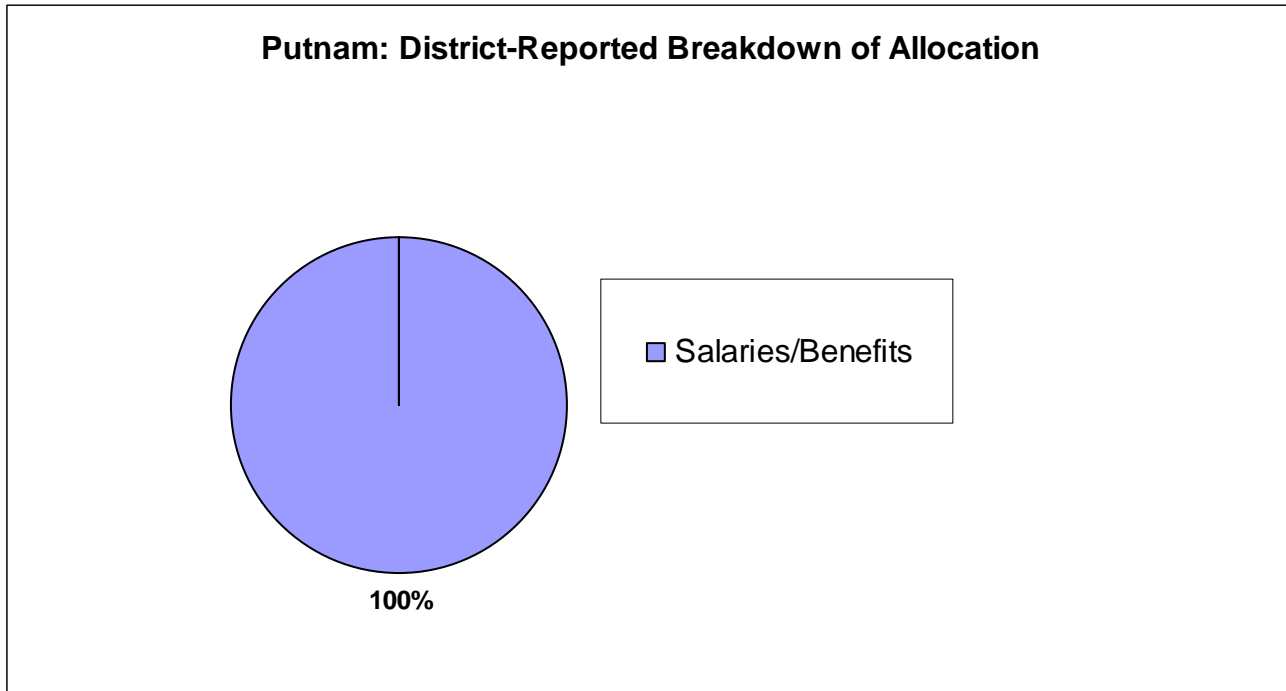
## FLORIDA EDUCATION FINANCE PROGRAM

As referenced in F. S. 1008.25 (7)(b)(2)(g), Summer Reading Camps are available to each third grader scoring Level 1 on FCAT. The purpose of these intensive camps is to make sure students are stronger readers whether they will repeat third grade or move on to fourth grade. Each district designs a camp using state guidelines grounded in research.

## **STATE-PROVIDED EDUCATOR SUPPORT**

Since 2003, the Florida Legislature has funded Just Read, Florida! (with both state and federal funds) to provide services to Florida's educators in the areas of reading professional development, leadership training, technical assistance to districts, research-based reading materials and assessments, and parental involvement.

As part of *No Child Left Behind*, *Reading First* is a competitive grant program that provides participating districts with principal and teacher training, highly-trained reading coaches, and research-based materials and assessments for grades K-3. Currently, 584 schools across the state are participating. Regional coordinators with strong reading and teaching backgrounds work with each *Reading First* school to provide instructional support.
